Title: Israel Rejects God's Provision

Passage: Numbers 11–12

Principle: God is displeased when we complain.

Praise: "This Is the Day"

Prompt: Ask your child these questions:

- Why did the Israelites complain about God's provision?
- How did God punish the people?
- Who interceded for the Israelites?
- Is God pleased when we complain?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

- By thanking God for the blessings in our lives.
- By being an example to others by having a thankful and obedient heart.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 11–12.

Next Week: Numbers 13-14

Title: Israel Rejects God's Plan **Passage:** Numbers 13–14

Principle: God's plans always are best. **Praise:** "Great Is Thy Faithfulness"

Prompt: Ask your child these questions:

- Why did Moses send spies into Canaan?
- How many spies did he send?
- What kind of report did the spies bring back?
- Which spies trusted the Lord?
- How did God punish the Israelites?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

- By thanking God for His promises.
- By obeying God's instructions.
- By trusting that God's plan is best.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 13–14.

Next Week: Numbers 16

Title: Israel Rejects God's Prophet and Priest

Passage: Numbers 16

Principle: We should obey and respect the leadership that God has established.

Praise: "Humble Thyself in the Sight of the Lord"

Prompt: Ask your child these questions:

- What were the names of the men who did not trust God's choice of leadership in Moses?
- How did God punish Korah, Dathan, and Abiram?
- Why did the people complain?
- Who interceded for the sins of the people?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

By valuing the leadership God has put in his life.

By not blaming leaders in difficult times.

By learning from the Lord's discipline.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 16.

Next Week: Numbers 21

Title: God offers Israel Healing from Sin

Passage: Numbers 21:4–9

Principle: God is merciful and faithful. **Praise:** "I Will Sing of the Mercies" **Prompt:** Ask your child these questions:

• Why did Israel complain?

How did God punish the Israelites?

- Did the people admit they had sinned?
- How did God offer healing from the snakebites?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

- By not complaining about God's provision.
- By remembering God's faithfulness in the past.
- By trusting Jesus as Savior.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 21:4–9.

Next Week: Numbers 22–24

Title: God Blesses Israel through Balaam

Passage: Numbers 22–24

Principle: God is sovereign and keeps His promises.

Praise: "In My Life, Lord, Be Glorified" **Prompt:** Ask your child these questions:

- Why did Balak want Balaam to curse Israel?
- What did God tell Balaam?
- What did God allow Balaam's donkey to do?
- What did God allow Balaam to do to Israel?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

- By serving and obeying God in everything he does.
- By checking his motives to be sure they are for God's glory
- By remembering that God's blessing is unchangeable.

This Week: As a family, read Numbers 22–24.
