a. Christ's death on the cross paid the full penalty for our sins and purchased eternal salvation. His atoning sacrifice enables God to justify sinners freely without compromising the perfection of divine righteousness (Rom. 3:24–26).

b. His resurrection from the dead declares His victory over sin and death (I Cor. 15:54–57).

c. Salvation is by grace through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ alone—plus and minus nothing (Eph. 2:8–9).

d. Sinners cannot earn salvation or favor with God (Rom. 8:8).

e. God requires of those who are saved no preparatory works or prerequisite self-improvement (Rom. 10:13; 1 Tim. 1:15).

f. Eternal life is a gift of God (Rom. 6:23).

g. Believers are saved and fully justified before their faith ever produces a single righteous work (Eph. 2:10).

h. Christians can and do sin (1 John 1:8,10).

i. Christians wage a constant and intense struggle against sin in the flesh (Rom. 7:15–24).

j. Genuine believers sometimes commit heinous sins, as David did in 2 Samuel 11.

k. The gospel calls sinners to faith joined in oneness with repentance (Acts 2:38; 17:30; 20:21; 2 Pet. 3:9).

I. Repentance is turning from sin (Acts 3:19; Luke 24:47). It is not a work but a divinely bestowed grace (Acts 11:18; 2 Tim. 2:25).

m. Repentance is a change of heart, but genuine repentance will effect a change of behavior as well (Luke 3:8 ; Acts 26:18–20).

n. Jesus is Lord of all, and the faith He demands involves unconditional surrender (Rom. 6:17–18 ; 10:9–10).
